



Procedure:

The concept Rhein Ruhr City 2032 contributes 100% to the IOC's Agenda 2020. The IOC's Agenda 2020, headed by its President Dr. Thomas Bach, and the further development of the Agenda in recent months mean that for the first time in the history of the Olympic and Paralympic Games, regions can also apply for the Games. In addition, the elimination of the minimum capacity of spectator seats allows more flexible use of existing or temporary sports facilities in a city or region. In addition, 115.000 hotel beds can already be offered as overnight accommodation in the region. The IOC's target is 42.000 beds. The concept of the Rhein Ruhr City 2032 initiative is the first concept that pays 100% into the Agenda 2020 and it is already sustainable before the Games.
